Washington's legal community began to realize the public needs were not being met, however it took more than a decade to work toward a new solution.

LLLT became the first known program in the United States to provide an affordable option for family law legal assistance for those unable to afford an attorney.

Many states are now reaching out to Washington for guidance as they determine how to make it work in their own states.

This license is currently only issued for family law and allows for extensive assistance in most, but not all, family law matters from beginning to end.

Most Common Process in Family Law Matter

Temporary Orders

Commonly entered at the start of the case to address a parenting schedule, child support, household expenses, and/or spousal maintenance.

Mediation

We accompany you to mediation to work out a resolution in your case and to ensure there is a binding agreement when you walk away at the end of the day.

*Mediator fee is separate from our fees and will vary

Parenting Seminar

All cases involving children require the parties to attend a parenting seminar. The case schedule provides a deadline and each county provides acceptable providers.

Confirmation of Issues (King County)

A document required to be filed in all cases, with joint cooperation of the parties to submit to the court.

Status Conference

The court requires appearance to determine whether the case may proceed to trial or if there are deficiencies that need to be addressed.

Pretrial Conference

The court will determine information related specific to trial such as date/number of witnesses/deadlines to submit documents in preparation for trial.

Trial

Final presentation in attempt to get orders you are seeking.

*\$2,500 deposit required 60 days prior to trial.
